
APhA-ASP Regional Officer Elections

Previous Leadership and Experience

During my time in pharmacy school, I have had the privilege of gaining leadership experience through APhA Academy of Student Pharmacists (ASP) at the local level for the first three years of my pharmacy school journey.

In my P1 year, I served as Member at Large for the APhA-ASP chapter at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center College of Pharmacy. In this position, I helped plan a fundraiser for student scholarships, plan a service event educating patients about the importance of HIV testing and PrEP in high-risk situations, and assist with other leadership projects happening with the executive committee. This position allowed me to gain insight into APhA-ASP and the importance of service, advocacy, and professional development available within the organization. At the end of my P1 year, I was elected as Chapter President-Elect for my school's chapter of APhA-ASP, and I served in this position until the end of my P2 year. In this position, I worked with the Chapter President to plan fundraisers and learn how to lead my school's chapter. I was also able to lead the Members at Large across three campuses and help them gain a better understanding of APhA-ASP.

I am currently a third-year student pharmacist and serving as the Chapter President of APhA-ASP at my school. In this position, I lead weekly executive committee meetings across three campuses, plan social events, lead monthly general body meetings, and communicate information to students about membership, advocacy, and all things APhA-ASP!

My time with APhA-ASP has shown me the importance of communication and teamwork. My school's chapter operates in three cities and two time zones, so a majority of our communication is electronic, whether through email, zoom, or phone calls. This can at times be a challenge, but I feel it has strengthened my ability to communicate with others. As a regional officer, I will be responsible for communicating with student pharmacists from a variety of schools, mostly via email. My experience communicating electronically will help me excel with communication across a larger geographic region.

As Chapter President, I have worked hard to think innovatively about ways our chapter can increase member involvement. This has included encouraging more social events across all three campuses and changing the chapter's operating procedures to allow for an equal opportunity for leadership across the state.
